
Contributing to our students' success

#### Managing climate change risk in global supply chains

Climate change is leading to disruption in global supply chains, impacting on production and supply, raising costs and prices, and reducing revenues. Dr Ghadge's work focuses on the intersection between these impacts and the global supply chain, identifying strategies that can be used by senior managers to manage impact and mitigate its effect on operations.


