- Practical understanding of how to secure a non-executive position.
- Networking opportunities with high-profile peer executives and contributing experts to support you in your future NED career.
- · Greater confidence in pursuing a non-executive placement and creating your 'portfolio career'.
- · Clarity about the key attributes of an effective NED and how you can develop them.
- Contextual awareness of how to apply your knowledge and skills to boardroom challenges in different organisations.

#### **Entry criteria**

Applicants for the scholarship must demonstrate that they meet the standard entry criteria for the programme, and they must be working in the charity sector in either an employed or voluntary capacity. To be considered for the programme applicants must:

- Be business credible i.e. have a significant track record of experience and knowledge of their own sector such that they have credibility to coach senior leaders in the sector.
- Have an intrinsic interest in learning about becoming a NED.
- Charity organisation must have a turnover of less than £10 million.

In addition, applicants must:

• Intend to and can demonstrate how they will use their training for charitable purposes and how the lives of others will be improved as a result.
